### Acknowledgement of Indigenous Territory

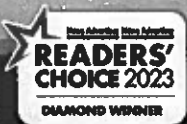

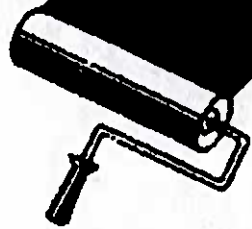
