### Acknowledgement of Indigenous Territory

It is a great privilege to gather, share stories of faith and worship God on this beautiful territory, which we now know as Scarborough but which has been the site of human activity – and therefore storytelling and worship – for many thousands of years. 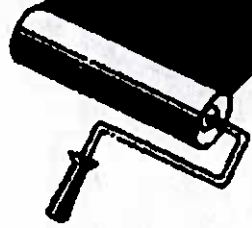
