

Acknowledgement of Indigenous Territory

It is a great privilege to gather, share stories of faith and worship God on this beautiful territory, which we now know as Scarborough but which has been the site of human activity – and therefore storytelling and worship – for many thousands of years. The land on which we gather is the traditional territory of the Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee, Anishinabek, Odawa, Mississaugas of the New Credit, Mississaugas of Scugog, Hiawatha, Curve Lake and Alderville First Nations, and the Métis Nation. It was the subject of many treaties and covenants. Today, Toronto is home to Indigenous people from across Turtle Island. We are grateful for the opportunity to gather on this territory and work in this community, and we commit ourselves to the work of reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples.




